
Netherlands (outer circle)

- I am not aware that the EU is involved in dealing with crises


## 2 Effectiveness of EU crisis management


#### Providing relief for large natural disasters (e.g. floods, wildfires, earthquakes)



### In the aftermath of a major crisis, arranging the recovery and restoring normal life




## Role of the EU in crisis management

**Q3** To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? (%)

The EU should be more involved in preparedness efforts for future crises, through actions such as raising awareness, organising training and crisis simulation exercises



In addition to communication by national authorities, the EU should play a more active role in providing timely information and guidance to citizens



The EU should be provided with the necessary resources to anticipate, prepare for and respond to major crises, even if this means slightly reducing EU funding in other areas



National and EU level crisis response would be better supported by a commonly agreed group of EU leading experts, providing scientific evidencebased advice
